Upcoming Marching and JAZZ Performances

We have three home performances scheduled on 9/11, 10/2 and 10/16. These are spaced nicely through our season and you will see significant changes to our show from one performance to the next. Please fill our stands again to support our kids! IN ADDITION, we are still planning a Virtual performance for a Bands of America judging panel as well as a D214 Marching Showcase. I will keep you posted as more info becomes available. We are considering DRIVE-IN CONCERTS for the jazz ensembles at periodic times through the fall in our parking lots at night – a fun twist to accommodate our current situation. LASTLY – we are exploring sharing our Friday night performances with other music groups. More info to follow.

Jazz Ensemble Update

<u>Jazz Ensemble 1</u> will hold their normal 8th hour virtual class and will be responsible for weekly assignments. We will have one weekly rehearsal outside on Thursday nights from 6:15-7:30 (including the health screening) and beginning on September 3.

<u>Jazz Ensemble 2</u> will begin Thursday Sept 10, 7:45-9:15pm (including health screening). Mr. Neil Carson will again be teaching our Jazz Ensemble 2 this year. He provided some extremely creative and energetic instruction last year, and I know this will again be the case this year. In addition to being one of the top jazz calls in the city, he is a fantastic, caring teacher.

<u>ALL:</u> Thursday nights will continue until the weather changes. Be sure to check the calendar for all of the jazz ensemble concerts in November, January, February and April – they will be updated as things change to accommodate our current pandemic. Any known conflicts with ANY jazz rehearsal should be shared ASAP with Mr. C (and Mr. Carson with Jazz 2).

DRIVE IN CONCERTS

We are exploring Jazz Concerts in the Hersey parking lot – sit in the back of your minivan, pickup truck, on the hood of your car - you name it. More info to follow.

Private Lessons at Hersey– a different look this fall.

Due to the reputation and history of our band program, we are turning away many private teachers that would like to be a part of our program. I have interviewed and selected all of the private lesson teachers on staff at Hersey from a large pool of applicants. Zoom is a reality of our current situation and our teachers have adjusted for a great experience online – this should NOT BE A DETERRENT to lessons!!!! This group of professionals are handpicked and will make a HUGE difference to our student's success!! The resumes are impressive and personalities appropriate. All of the teachers at Hersey have gone through the same security checks that all teachers in District 214 must clear. I ENCOURAGE you to have your son/daughter study with one of these hand-picked teachers. Currently, ALL members of the Symphonic Band study privately and app. 80% of the concert band study privately.

<u>Hersey Auditions</u>: Hersey auditions will begin the <u>week of October 26</u>. They will consist of two short etudes and the scale sheet. Freshman, particularly, should start work on the scale sheet as soon as possible to be ready by that time. There will also be sightreading. The sightreading component on <u>SMARTMUSIC</u> is truly outstanding and a vital tool to improving this skill in your playing repertoire, as well as improving your audition scores. IMEA District VII Band:



We will be doing this process slightly different this year. The ILMEA auditions will be videos, but our preauditions will be on Zoom. As we get closer, I'll set up a Signup Genius for students to secure times. All players sitting in the top three chairs of their section (or more) in Symphonic Band should be pre-auditioning for District Band. The etudes are the same as last March's audition and this October's audition (entire etude used for IMEA, however). As in the past we can only send the top 18 auditioners to audition for the IMEA Band and 12 auditioners for the IMEA Jazz Bands. Hersey annually sends the most students in our district to participate, including in some years 100% of those that make the Hersey cut to audition. This is also a great opportunity for students to be prepared for their upcoming Hersey auditions, which will consist of the same material as the IMEA auditions. The one on one feedback from Mr. C is very valuable, as well.


It is unclear what volunteer needs we will have for the remainder of marching season, but we appreciate your willingness to jump in when needs arise.

All online orders must be placed for pickup at the same time/location of the fundraiser. Delivery cannot be counted at this time. Gift card purchases during fundraisers do not count towards total donated sales, but purchases made with an existing gift card will count.



The Scrip Gift Card Fundraiser is a program where you can buy gift cards at face value from Scrip and a rebate from the gift card of 1.5% to 30%, depending on the retailer, goes directly to HIA. HIA then splits the fundraising rebates between your student account (80%) and HIA general fund (20%)! You can use \$\$\$ from your student account to pay for anything like band fees, private lesson fees, etc. An easy way to earn money by purchasing gift cards for stores you shop everyday!


