The Art of Music

I hope that everyone is having a great summer! The intention of this letter is to prepare everyone for band camp and the upcoming fall season. I can't wait for the beginning of band camp where we will have fun, challenge ourselves, and continue to strive for EXCELLENCE in every way. I am confident that we will continue to maintain the tradition of pride and excellence established over decades at John Hersey High School. In addition to our work on the show, we have some great group activities planned throughout band camp. We have great music selected, another great drill, and some new fresh faces on the staff. It's going to be a great year!

MUSIC TESTING

We have already begun work on "The Art of Music". The challenge of this year's music is significant and will require home preparation from everyone, as always. Use the MusicFirst assignments to learn the music, but remember that there are many steps after passing MusicFirst. Please be ready for your memorization tests on Part 1 that will begin on the first day of camp. MusicFirst testing is only the first step, but a necessary one. This is great music that will keep us challenged throughout the fall season.

Everyone received the following music in June rehearsals: Part 1, and Part 2. Part 3 will be uploaded to the <u>Google drive folder</u> (link can be found in the digital newsletter) with all of the show music. If you are missing music listed above, it is your responsibility to collect it from your section leader or download it from the <u>Google Folder</u>. Email me if you need contact information for your section leader. We will be spending August music rehearsal time reinforcing fundamentals and memorizing (not learning parts). ALL MUSICFIRST TESTING ON PART 1 AND PART 2 **MUST** BE COMPLETED BEFORE THE FIRST DAY OF CAMP. In addition, you will NOT BE allowed to begin memorization testing until all MusicFirst testing is passed.

GRADING PROCESS

The grading process will be different this year. Students will be tested via MusicFirst on all three parts of the show. Students will have memorization tests on all three parts of the show. Memorization testing begins the second day of camp for parts 1-2. Memorization testing on Part 3 will occur later on during band camp.

Memorization testing grading will be done by Mr. Hile and other members of the marching band staff. If students pass their memorization test the first time they will receive a 95%. If you do not have the music adequately memorized you will be asked to retake your memorization test. Each retake will lower your grade by 10%.

Our success as a group depends on everyone BEING PREPARED WHEN YOU ARRIVE! Your first quarter/semester grade will be affected by your performance these first days of band camp, **BUT MOST IMPORTANTLY**, your peers and the success of this organization are dependent upon your commitment to excellence in musical performance.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance at Band Camp and ALL scheduled rehearsals is VITAL to our success as an ensemble. Every single person is important!! During Band Camp we will be setting expectations, developing group unity, learning music and marching drills that will last throughout the fall and the school year. We expect everyone at all rehearsals. All conflicts should have been registered with Mr. Hile via email. As you know, our competitors practice SIGNIFICANTLY more than Hersey, so attendance at each rehearsal is vital to our success. Please email conflicts immediately if you have not done so already. If there are appointments or other conflicts that can be moved to avoid missing rehearsal, PLEASE DO SO IMMEDIATELY for the benefit of everyone in the program.

2022 MARCHING BAND COSTS

The first marching band fee payment of \$250 should have been received in June. Students should bring the remaining \$150 of the marching band fees with them to Band Camp. All fees must be submitted by Tuesday, August 2nd. This is a nonrefundable fee that has already been contracted to clinicians who will be helping us in August and throughout the year. In addition, this cost covers the band T-shirt and shorts that will be used throughout the year, a pair of BLACK gloves, and meals on competition days. The uniform requires that every student will wear black gloves and the same, uniform black shoes. All students will wear the same shoe available through our uniform committee. No personal shoes will be acceptable. If you need new shoes, please take care of this immediately by contacting our Uniform Committee at hia.uniformcoordinator@gmail.com.

MARCHING UNIFORM FITTINGS

The HIA Uniform Committee will conduct marching uniform fittings in August. All students will need to try on their uniforms during the fitting sessions to confirm fit. Please watch for a Google Uniform Fitting Survey and a Signup Genius with fitting dates and times in the coming weeks.

LANYARDS

Show your support at the band competitions and home games by wearing a lanyard with a photo of your student(s) in uniform. Photos will be taken in August. If you purchase a lanyard you can also purchase a digital copy of the photo. The order form is included with this newsletter. Great news! Despite rising costs, we're able to offer these lanyards at the same price as last year.

AUGUST 12 - PARENT MEETING AND FALL PREVIEW PERFORMANCE

We will be having a mandatory meeting for ALL band parents on Friday, August 12th before our parent preview performance. We will meet with Freshman parents first at 5:30 PM and ALL parents at 6:00 PM. These meetings will be brief but will also help us kick off some changes that are coming to the program this year to our fundraisers/logistics.

After our meeting, the band will perform a preview for you of our show in the stadium!

MARCHING BAND FALL PRACTICE SCHEDULE

All members will attend Wednesday evening rehearsal 6 - 8:45pm from August 17 to October 19th (please notice the adjustments to rehearsal to accommodate Yom Kippur/Rosh Hashanah in October.). We have a mandatory afternoon rehearsal on August 20th from 12:00-5:00 PM with our marching show designer. There are additional sectionals for all students in the marching percussion sections.

MUSIC EXPECTATIONS FOR ALL STUDENTS

Everyone is expected to know their music when they arrive for Band Camp as described in the "Music Testing" section. If anyone is having problems with sections of the music, take it to your private lesson teacher or set up an appointment with me and I will be glad to help. Your Section Leader is also a good resource for assistance. We began testing in June and will continue testing everyone during the first few days of camp - BE PREPARED. Music First assignments must be completed before the first day of camp. We will begin memorization testing on the first day of camp. This testing will impact your semester grade.

SECTION LEADERS

We will be having an important orientation and leadership session on July 29 from 10:00AM-12:00PM for Section Leaders, as outlined in the schedule above. Your leadership ability will have a direct impact upon the success of your section and our fall season. I look forward to continuing your preparation for this responsibility and helping any way that I can. We have already had a great start and I look forward to continuing in the same direction.

SHARED SPOTS

A few freshman students will share a spot in the drill. This simply means that a few students will alternate practicing in a particular drill spot throughout the season. Students will be assigned a shared spot based upon instrumentation needs, individual performance level or frequent rehearsal conflicts. These spots will be assigned during Band Camp and will rarely change once school starts. Students in shared spots will also alternate game and competition performances.

CLINICIANS 2022–2023

Program Coordinator – Rob Ferguson has been hired to coordinate all creative aspects of our show and we have been working together since late November to develop the show this year. Rob is the percussion caption head for the Phantom Regiment Drum and Bugle Corp and also the program director for the Matrix Indoor Drumline. The band will continue to perform great music literature, but brings a fresh outlook to all that we have done in the past. Be ready for some changes....

Marching Visual Caption and WW's –Ms. Ilona Hutter will be out this year because she is having a baby! Ilona's replacement is Mr. Josh Johnson. Josh was previously a drum major of the Phantom Regiment Drum and Bugle Corp for two summers. He has extensive marching experience and will be a huge asset to our program this fall.

Percussion - Mr. Tom Leddy will be stepping back from a day to day role and will be facilitating percussion instruction and occasionally coming in to work with the percussion section. He holds music performance degrees from Indiana University and DePaul University and is an active drummer in the Chicagoland area. Tom teaches most of our percussion students privately during the school year.

Drumline - Mr. Curt Schwarzkopf is our new Drumline Caption Head for this season. Curt was the center snare for the Marching Illini and also has experience marching in Drum Corps and WGI percussion. Curt is also an alumni of Hersey High School.

Frontline Percussion – Mr. Chris Kenney is new to our staff this year. Chris is an alumni of Lockport High School and Northern Illinois University.

Percussion – Colin Rambert returns as a Percussion Instructor again this year. Colin graduated from Millikin University and the University of Illinois with Percussion Performance degrees and is in his third year on our staff.

Color Guard – Ms. Sara Reich will be returning in charge of our guard this year. She is a graduate of John Hersey High School and Ball State University. In addition, she spent 2008-2010 in the Blue Stars Drum and Bugle Corp as a color guard member.

Marching Visual Tech – Mr. Elliott Hile (I wonder who he is) is joining our staff this year to help with our visuals and choreography throughout the season. Mr. Hile has worked with a number of high school bands in the Chicago area.

Drill Writer - Mr. Thomas Spalding is our new drill writer this year and brings a fresh look to our band program. In addition to writing drills for several marching bands, including national finalist bands in Ohio, Mr. Spalding is also on the percussion staff for the Phantom Regiment.

PREPARING FOR BAND CAMP

The following list will help you prepare for the upcoming camp. These items are necessary to make you as comfortable as possible. Please ensure that you have these items for the first day of camp.

Clothing

- Tennis shoes no heels, no sandals (NO high top sneakers- they restrict ankle movement and hinder good marching)
- Loose, comfortable clothing
- A hat and sunglasses to protect eyes and face
- Suntan lotion for afternoons
- Insect repellent for evenings

Drill and Instruments

- Download UBDapp Pro on your phone
 - Login information will be given on the first day of camp
- Make sure your instrument is in working order.
- School-owned instruments make sure that one is available and that it works!!! I will be in school by July 27 in the morning or late afternoon (email Mr. Hile) - come in and check one out, if needed. The first day of camp is too late to take care of this.

Food and Beverage

- A water bottle that can be tied/attached to your lanyard so that you can get a drink during rehearsal without leaving the field.
 - Water for refilling bottles will be provided.
- Eat large, healthy meals throughout camp, particularly breakfast!
- BRING A DINNER Going out will make you late returning to camp. Dinner will be 45 minutes and will fall at APPROXIMATELY the 5pm hour (depending upon the flow of the day).

Band Camp Kit Information

All students except frontline percussion and color guard should have ordered a band camp kit in May. You will receive the band camp kit the first day of band camp. The kit includes:

- Chalk in a baggie with a strap
- Water bottle lanyard that can hold a 16oz. water bottle
- Ultimate Drillbook App (please download UBDapp Pro)
